### REVISED DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY, LOCAL PLAN

Dear Sirs,

My primary objections to the proposed plan are as follows:-

#### 1. Air Pollution

Air pollution in the affected area already exceeds EU stipulated safe levels and is, therefore, illegal. The increased traffic resulting from the plan will only exacerbate the pollution situation underlining the Council's disregard for EU law.

Of additional concern is that this pollution is in an area with several schools, therefore exposing children to the increased pollution.

### 2. Traffic congestion

The traffic mitigation proposal is for traffic lights at the Myton Road/Banbury Road and St. Nicholas Church Street/Banbury Road junctions. This means four sets of traffic lights from the Gallows Hill/Banbury Road junction to Eastgate. There is currently extensive congestion from Gallows Hill to Eastgate and along the Myton Road from around 8.15 a.m. and 3.45 p.m. during the start and finish of the school days at Warwick School, King's High School and Myton School and continuing with the beginning and end of the working days at Warwick Technology Park and Jaguar and Aston Martin at Gaydon. The two additional sets of traffic lights coupled with the traffic resulting from the proposed new housing build can only make this congestion very much worse.

The Council appears not to have taken note that junctions with sets of synchronised traffic lights take a substantial time to clear. At times of heavy traffic vehicles are unable to cross because tailbacks form - this is well demonstrated by the traffic lights currently placed by the Gallows Hill/Banbury Road junction.

#### 3. Bridge Crossing the River Avon

There is no mention that the bridge crossing the River Avon, which is bound to take increased traffic, is considered able to take this extra load, nor what plans are in hand should this - the only crossing into Warwick - be closed for any reason. Currently the weight load restrictions for the bridge are ignored. Can we expect that drivers of heavy vehicles will take notice in future?
