I wish to support the proposed sites 1-5inc. They would have the least impact and change to the village.
However, if the Police HQ land is not available we should be careful to reduce the number of houses agreed on other sites as when the police land does come available for housing we would have far too many for such a small village with limited amenities.
Also, if the village is taken out of the Green Belt, this would facilitate additional infill houses.
I would only be prepared to support an additional 15% increase in the number of dwellings $\hat{=}$ to say 57. Other villages appear to have figures in this order or less.
Site 13 appears to be a logical site for initial development if the Police HQ is not immediately available.
I would strongly object to any development on sites 7 & 10. Both of these would have a massively detrimental affect on the landscape. Many people walk the perimeter of the golf course and enjoy the stunning views around this area. Developing these sites would ruin the conservation area. A local farmer grazes his Dexter herd on site 10. It would be a great pity to lose this unique agricultural land. The wildlife in this area is a great asset to the village and it must be protected.
