

(1) The proposed site is located within the green bett.

(2) The site will have an adverse effect upon the landscape and is

out of keeping with the surrounding area.

(3) The location of this proposed site, on a main gateway approach unto Warwick by both road and canal and will be detrimental to tourism for Halton Flight and Warwick town centre.

1 There is high levels of sensitive nature conservation in the immediate area, supported by British Waterways.

(5) The proposed site is well below the surrounding ground levels and prove to flooding

@ There is inadequate service infrastructure to support the proposed site.

There will be a detrimental effect upon local ecology.

The land on this site could revert to quality agricultural stock

easily

Without additional new infrastructure there is a danger of contamination to the proposed site and surrounding area, plus increased noise from manoweving vehicles.

The proposed site will have a severe detrimental visual effect upon this towist area and gateway into Warwick

(1) The site is located well below the surrounding ground level, will be viewed from both road and caugl making screening difficult and probably futile.

Access to the site is dangerous, with several serious and tatal accidents having occured along this stretch of road.

- (3) The site location lacks suitable local shops, available medical and school facilities and regular public transport facilities.
- The proposed site is isolated from other residential properties and completely out of character.
- (B) The land is privately owned, a compulsory purchase order would be required to secure this site.
- The proposed site is located on a busy main commuten route into warnich, is sandwiched between road and canal thus being dangerous fer both children and adults.
- (1) The proposed site is on a prime towist route and would have a devastating effect upon the local economy.
- (8) The site is too small for twing vehicles and not fit for purpose
- (19) The proposed site is privately owned and not recidily available, the potential additional costs required to enable suitability for this site, does not equate to the number of proposed sites gained and therefore not cost effective.
