Question 7

The most significant reason for objection is the proposed access to the site from Barcheston Drive. This is not simple to facilitate access to the site and will have a hugely detrimental impact on the Hatton Park Village Hall, (HPVH) if it were to be allowed to proceed. The topographical levels between Barcheston Drive and the site are significant and will potentially require both the tarmac and the loose surfaced car park areas and may also need the sports facility to enable an appropriate access to address the level changes. These areas have only recently been enhanced to address the increased demand from the community for HPVH.

The aerial photograph below shows clearly the proximity of the existing vehicle access from Barcheston Drive to the existing residential site adjacent to HPVH. There would not appear to be sufficient space to incorporate an access at this point without significantly impacting HPVH. The visibility splays will be restricted by levels, the existing adjacent development boundary wall and the bus stop.

The proposed relocation to the other side of HPVH of the access / car park seems ill conceived in that it will force the interaction of people and vehicles that was specifically avoided in the current layout. This has to be considered a greater risk to the children playing in the park / play area and orchard located to the north of HPVH.
