

4000 plus homes south of Warwick & Leamington is far too many. Apart from a few south of Kenilworth none are proposed in the north of the district.

In these times when the Government is urging councils to build so many homes, its about time that the Green Belt policy is reviewed. Its unfair to push all the homes into a small area, especially as the infrastructure is already stretched to capacity. There is a danger that villages such as mine (Borford) and Bishops Techbrook will be swallowed whole if development carries on <sup>in the</sup> south.

Its already difficult getting into Warwick and Leamington at peak times with traffic from the south only being one major route into each of these towns.

The changes made to Prince's Drive do not appear to have improved traffic flow and to my mind are dangerous. There needs to be a "buffer" zone south of Warwick and Leamington to stop further development taking over our villages.

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
