1. Preferred Site 1 - your document says up to 100 homes, but Gladman's leaflet says up to 130 homes so let us assume they intend to pack in as many as possible -
2. 130 homes = approx 400-500 additional people, which will put pressure on many village services
3. The school is virtually at capacity and cannot be enlarged.
4. There will be additional traffic at both the school, and the shop & post office, on narrow lanes which are already too busy.
5. 130 homes = approx 250 additional cars trying to use Southam Road at peak times. It already is here-to-tail in the mornings and there have been numerous accidents.

If site 1 is overthrown my preference would be

1. No new development at all for reasons above
 2. Site 3 only
 3. Sites 2 + 3 together
