Our objections to Site 1 are:-

1. History. Residents & tourists enjoy our history. When it is gone, it is forever. It is likely that there are archaeological remains from mediaeval housing plus from the closeness of King Offa's lodge & the Civil War camp.
2. Loss of setting - summed up in 1994 Planning Inspector's report
3. Access & traffic. At peak times traffic on the Southam Road will be significantly worsened. Access from Offchurch Lane will be most difficult leading to even more accidents at this dangerous junction.

Why Sites 2 & 3 are better:-

1. Historical centre not destroyed
2. Enhanced road safety. Earlier start to 30mph limit will slow cars from Southam.
3. Some new estate cars will exit via Fosse Way.
