

We recommend site numbers 2 and 3 as supported by the parish council

Site number 1 is in an attractive rural setting. Development on this scale will transform the location from an established small superior ribbon on Offchurch Lane to a significant mixed housing location.

If traffic is directed in and out through Church Lane, then ~~some~~ a traffic management system e.g. lights will be essential and as access and exit to/from Church Lane and School Lane are already difficult and dangerous.

Exiting from Offchurch Lane is already difficult and dangerous at this blind junction. Hundreds more homes are planned for Southam and the surrounding district. Many of those residents will commute daily through Radford Lane adding further to congestion at this point in the village.

A pedestrian crossing, traffic lights controlling four traffic flows, plus Offchurch Lane will all concentrate at this point.

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
