


Site 1. Objections

Building on this site would increase the density of traffic on to a road which is very busy at key times. It is already a difficult junction for vehicles at a point of access identified by the developer. School Lane has for many years experienced parking and traffic problems due to its narrowness and the presence of a school. More and more children are attending the school from out of area (approx 40%) so at certain times of the day there is already traffic congestion. Currently there is build up of traffic at the Offchurch Lane / Southam Rd junction. Slow moving traffic on the Southam Road denies ease of access for vehicles on Offchurch Lane. Even more vehicles gaining access to the Southam Rd at the church lane junction would exacerbate this problem. ^{Loss of rural landscape}

Site 2 & 3. Objections

vehicles from these (fields) sites would increase the density of traffic on to the Southam Rd leading to traffic congestion further into the village towards Leamington. There is currently difficulty in gaining access on to the Southam Rd from any of the roads in the village - Lewis Rd, School Lane, Hall Fields, Kingshurst, Offchurch Lane at key times in the day. There is no safe walk way into the village from these sites. ^{Loss of Rural landscape}

Site 4. Objections

Access to the Southam Rd would be a major problem. School Lane is narrow and congested at certain times, so more vehicles would exacerbate the problem and lead to difficulties at the junction to Southam Rd. Housing on this site could jeopardise the future integrity of the village.

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Building on any of the sites would cause tremendous traffic problems. Building in Southam would also affect the amount of traffic using the Southam Rd into Leamington. A by-pass is needed - muted decades ago!!!
