Sheet 1 Village Housing Options

Hill Wootton is a small rural hamlet with about 26 houses. There are no facilities such as gas, public transport, street lights and largely without pavements.

There is a dangerous blind bend at the site of the proposed development on the right turn when coming from Leek Wootton and an equally difficult access up to it at the crossroads with the Warwick Road both of which have been the site of many accidents.

The lane where access to the field would be leads to farmyards and a livery and large farm vehicles and horse boxes and horses use it regularly. The farmer already has problems when there are extra parked cars from houses in the lane.

The proposed field is part of the agricultural area of Hill Wootton and is surrounded by similar fields in the Green Belt which may then also be considered for development. Then this small rural hamlet would be lost for ever.

There are places in Hill Wootton which could would be more suitable for small scale development which could be done sympathetically without changing the character of the hamlet or threatening its rural nature. Many people think of Hill Wootton as a place which they enjoy using or visiting to ride, walk and cycle. If there has to be development it needs to be done more appropriately.

This is an agricultural area with two farms and liveries. Insetting it out of the Green Belt wash is inappropriate as this hamlet is surrounded by Green Belt farmland and it should be protected.
